#### **VA Dental Insurance?**

As most of us have known for decades, the VA does have oral surgeons and dentists on contract or will pay for dental work on a fee basis. Example: too few veterans took advantage of the one-time dental work paid for by the VA after we separated from active duty. We had 180 days after separation to apply. Second example: some veterans have a dental/oral damage service connected disability. Like any other service connected disability, the VA will either treat or in some cases pay for treatment. There is no time limit or number of treatments limit for any service connected disability. (The best illustration of this situation I know is friend who took an AK-47 round through his jaw.) Third example: a veteran actively enrolled in a VA vocational rehabilitation program gets darned near anything fixed that might otherwise interfere with his or her training, be it glasses, an adaptive van, or teeth fixed. Fourth and last "traditional" example: veteran Jones is a patient under VA physician Smith's care in the Indianapolis VA Medical Center. Jones has an ulcer, or lost part of his stomach to cancer, or has some digestive condition, or whatever. He needs to be able to chew his food well. Doctor Smith prescribes dental care and veteran Jones gets it.

Well, amazingly enough there's a new Department of Veterans Affairs dental benefit announced late last year: dental insurance. "Insurance" meaning "pay premiums". Before you dismiss the idea of dental insurance please consider that Polly and I have been covered by Delta Dental for at least ten years and it's paid off for us. We were eligible when I was actively participating in the Army Reserves and we continue to be eligible because I'm a military retiree. Our premiums are a little over \$50 per month. May sound expensive, but consider: Preventative examinations and basic cleanings every six months are covered in full. At the other extreme of the dental work scale, crowns are covered 50%. ('Which ain't bad if you get an \$800 crown.) But, I'm getting into specifics which may not be true about the particular plan you might choose. Heck, I might change to the VADIP! Several of the plans are cheaper than mine.

Here's the VA announcement:

VA is implementing a comprehensive national VA Dental Insurance Program (VADIP) to give enrolled Veterans and CHAMPVA beneficiaries the opportunity to purchase dental insurance through Delta Dental and MetLife at a reduced cost. Participation is voluntary. Purchasing a dental plan does not affect Veterans' eligibility for VA dental services and treatment. VADIP opens November 15 for the purchasing of plans, with coverage beginning January 1, 2014.

Covered services include diagnostic, preventative, surgical, emergency and endodontic/restorative treatment. <u>Delta Dental</u> and <u>MetLife</u> are offering multiple plans. Each participant pays the fixed monthly premiums for coverage and any copayments required, depending on the type of plan selected.

Dependents of Veterans, except those eligible under <u>CHAMPVA</u>, are not authorized to participate in VADIP. Those individuals may be eligible for separate dental insurance coverage offered by these carriers.

Beginning November 15, 2013, individuals interested in participating in VADIP may complete

an application online, over the phone or by mail. A direct link to each provider's VADIP webpage is available from <a href="https://www.va.gov/healthbenefits/VADIP">www.va.gov/healthbenefits/VADIP</a>. The following table shows contact information for each provider.

Coverage under VADIP begins January 1, 2014, and will be provided throughout the United States and its territories. The initial participation period will be at least 12 calendar months. Afterward, VADIP beneficiaries can renew their participation for another 12-month period or be covered month-to-month, as long as the participant remains eligible for coverage and VA continues VADIP.

Multiple plan options will allow participants to select a plan that provides benefits and premiums that meet their dental needs and budget. The offered plans vary and may include diagnostic, preventative, surgical, emergency and endodontic/restorative treatment. Each participant will pay a fixed monthly premium for coverage, in addition to any copayments required by his or her plan.
